It might come as a surprise that February 14<sup>th</sup>, Valentine's Day, is named after a Christian saint. Valentine was a priest and physician in Rome. He, along with St. Marius and his family, comforted martyrs during the persecution of Emperor Claudius II, the Goth. Eventually, Valentine was also arrested, condemned to death for his faith, beaten with clubs, and finally beheaded on February 14, AD 270. He was buried in the Flaminian Way.

It is amazing to think about what so many believers have sacrificed because of their love for Christ. Today in America, we have so many freedoms I wonder if we realize what a great privilege it is. We have the freedom to worship however we wish (so long as it does not break any laws), we can freely go to church on Sunday mornings or at other times, we can pray whenever we want, and so forth. Actually, very little is required of us in this country to follow Christ. It puts us to shame when compared with what the early Christians had to endure for their faith.

It ought to give us pause, to stop and think, how might I love the Lord and my neighbor better, starting this month, starting today. If we look to the example of Valentine, we have much to ponder. He loved the Lord and his fellow brothers and sisters in the faith to the point of death. To the point of death! What is more, we have the words and example of our Lord Jesus Christ, who said, "This is My commandment, that ye love one another, as I have loved you. Greater love hath no man than this, that he lay down his life for his friends. Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you" (John 15:12-14). Christ loved us so much that He gave His life for us, and this is His commandment, that we love one another as He has loved us. Valentine did just that.


Let us therefore recommit ourselves to love one another as Christ has loved us. Let us be faithful to our spouses and family, to our fellow brothers and sisters in the faith, and our fellow mankind, both those of our own country and the entire world. What a difference the world would be if we all lived like this! The book of Acts records how the early Christians were of one accord and shared everything in common (Acts 2:44-47). They were an example to the rest of the world of what it was like to love one another. Others would see how they loved one another and would be drawn to them.

St. Paul says in Philippians 1:3-6, 9, "I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ. And it is my prayer that your love may abound more and more. . ."

St. John says in his first epistle, chapter four, verses 7-10: "Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love. In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him. Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins."
