

I am excited about our study for Advent Wednesday services this year. We will be learning the Ten Commandments. For Advent, we will study Commandments 1-3, and during the Lent Wednesdays of 2026 we will look at Commandments 4-10.

You may recall the first three Commandments, and I am going to recite them here from the King James Version:

1. Thou shalt have no other gods before Me.
2. Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord, thy God, in vain.
3. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.

I am sure all of us can remember when we learned these commandments in Sunday school and Confirmation. That was a long time ago for me. A refresher would be good, after all, these are the Ten Commandments, the holy Law, which God gave to Moses on Mount Sinai in the form of two tablets of stone; where God Himself wrote the words on the tablets with His finger (Exodus 31:18). “The tablets were the work of God, and the writing was the writing of God, engraved on the tablets” (Exodus 32:16).

Sadly, before Moses was ever able to give these laws to the people of Israel they began to worship a golden calf at the foot of the mountain. The people waited for Moses, but apparently, he took too long for them. After 40 days they grew impatient and thought Moses had died. They lost faith and begged and persuaded Aaron to oversee the fashioning of a golden calf out of their jewelry, even saying about it, “These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!” (Exodus 32:4). When Moses finally came down the mountain and heard the singing and “saw the calf and the dancing” (Exodus 32:19a), “he threw the tablets out of his hands and broke them at the foot of the mountain (Exodus 32:19b). The tablets of the holy law broke just as the people had broken the first command, “Thou shalt have no other gods before Me” (Exodus 20:3). It is a sad commentary on our inability to keep the law; they couldn’t even keep the first one! Sometimes I feel like Moses on Mount Sinai, running up and down the Hills between Grace and Blessed Emmanuel churches preaching the Law and the Gospel. I have gotten to know Boulder Canyon Road quite well by now. I really enjoy it, and I look forward to our series on the Ten Commandments this Advent. Please come, as I am sure you will be surprised how relevant to our faith the commandments are. They are such a core and unique blessing and go to the heart of it all. They reveal to us the holy will of God and His desire for holiness in our lives. They are a sure guide to follow throughout all our days of pilgrimage.

When we keep the commandments, we please God and our neighbor and enjoy many blessings that God wishes for us here on earth. However, when we disobey the commandments, we bring much heartache and trouble into our lives and the lives of others. They are somewhat of a double-edged sword, for good when we keep them, for bad when we don’t. The question is, are we going to choose the good? I hope so! However, when we don’t the commandments show us our sin, and in this way teach us to flee to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ for His forgiveness.

You may remember how Jesus summed up the Ten Commandments with two when He said, “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets” (Matthew 22:37-40). Jesus Himself preached the Ten Commandments. Indeed, He preached the Law of God as severely as any preacher ever could. Nevertheless, we must remember that Jesus also died for our sins and was raised for our justification (Romans 4:25) and that this is why He came, to preach the truth in both Law and Gospel. It is certainly true that the preaching of the Law makes the Gospel that much sweeter. To that end, I pray that this Advent/ Lent series will bless us.


